Health Update

Health Canada Announces Compliance Monitoring Project (CMP) for Natural Health Product – Ethanol Based Hand Sanitizers <u>Cosmetics Alliance</u> was informed by Health Canada that the Health Product Compliance Directorate (HPCD) in collaboration with the Natural and Non-Prescription Health Product Directorate (NNHPD) will soon initiate a Compliance Monitoring Project (CMP) to survey a selection of hand sanitizers that are currently accessible on the Canadian market, to assess their compliance and to ensure they are safe for use by Canadian consumers. Cosmetics Alliance has been engaged with the HPCD with respect to communication of CMP reports and will continue to monitor the progress of this project.

CMPs are part of Health Canada's proactive activities planned reviews and is one way Health Canada uses to monitor compliance of products on the market. Further information about Health Canada's Compliance Monitoring project are available at the following <u>link</u>.

Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, many NHP hand sanitizers have been <u>recalled</u> <u>from the Canadian market</u> because they:

- contain ingredients that are not permitted by Health Canada,
- do not contain the right amount of active ingredient,
- contain impurities above acceptable limits,
- are not properly labelled or.
- are missing important risk information.

All ethanol-based NHP hand sanitizers in gel or liquid forms were considered for inclusion in the CMP. Products were selected using a combination of risk factors (e.g., sale to vulnerable populations) and objective criteria (e.g., sale in high volume) were used to arrive at a final list. The products collected through this project will be reviewed for labelling requirements, source ethanol and finished product documentation, and submitted for laboratory analysis which will include verification of alcohol content/concentration and levels of specific impurities.

Based on Health Canada's (HC) assessment, if a risk to health is identified, HC may take enforcement actions according to its <u>Compliance and Enforcement Policy (POL-0001)</u>, which could include recalls and public advisories. The primary objective of our compliance and enforcement approach is to address non-compliance using the most appropriate level of intervention. Please note that the NNHPD may suspend a product or site license if it is deemed necessary.

As always, in support of Health Canada's <u>Regulatory Transparency and Openness Framework</u> and the Treasury Board Secretariat's commitment to <u>Open Government</u>, the findings of this CMP will be posted on Health Canada's <u>website</u>.

Summary of the NNHPD's Multilateral Meeting Published by Health Canada

NNHPD published its summary of the Multilateral Meeting that took place on February 24, 2021. Filling CA's three seats at the "virtual table" were Beta Montemayor, Richard Parcels and Gulnara Gabidullina (Vice Chair of CA's Product Compliance & Market Access Committee).

NNHPD's newly appointed Director General, Natalie Page, opened the meeting with her team and officials from the Inspectorate (ROEB) providing the updates on the following key items:

- Forward Regulatory Plan
- NHP Inspections and NHP GMP Inspection Program Pilot
- Cannabis Science Advisory Committee
